REPORT DATE: January 13th, 2022

GENERAL: The Director is working on year-end reporting and closing out invoices. We are also looking ahead to the upcoming construction season and preparing bidding documents for each project.

The Director was involved with the interview panel & team for the new Park & Rec Director search. A decision and announcement should be coming this week!

The Director met with WE-Energies regarding a large high capacity gas main project that will run through Brown Deer and Mequon along County Line Road in the summer of 2023.

New black monotube traffic signals are being installed at N. 51st Street and W. Brown Deer Road week ending January 15th as part of the **Brown Deer Road** project. N. 51st Street will remain closed in the NB & SB direction at Brown Deer Road until the new signals are operational. The remainder of the Brown Deer Road project landscaping and miscellaneous concrete/asphalt work will be completed in early spring of 2022.

The **Green Bay Road** project has completed some traffic staging cutovers in the medians and some utility relocation work before shutting down for the winter. The bridge demolition and other major work will resume in the spring of 2022.

WINTER OPERATIONS: The DPW crew completed a plowing/salting operation over the New Year's holiday weekend. The plowing operation started at 4am on Sunday, January 2nd.

SANITARY SEWER: The Sanitary Sewer Technician is working

STORMWATER: The Director is working on the annual report for the Village's WDNR MS4 permit. Annually the stormwater activities are submitted to the WDNR per our permit requirements. Annual maintenance items such as catch basin cleaning, catch basin rebuilding, street sweeping, and inspections are submitted to the WDNR for review.

REMINDER: All culvert replacements and driveway approach paving work requires a permit. Culvert replacements are completed in-house by DPW crews ahead of the residential driveway approach paving. Please contact the DPW office for more information.

BEAUTIFICATION/FORESTRY: The DPW crew is working on ash tree removal along N. 55th Street & West Beaver Creek Parkway. The removal is a continuation of where the crew left off last year (2021).

The DPW crew removed some leaning trees on W. Calumet adjacent to the University Club gold course. DPW and the University Club are partnering and contracting with the tree service contractor M&M for additional tree removal along Calumet. There are dead ash trees in both the Village R/W along Calumet and on the University Club property (south side of the fence line). M&M will continue brush/tree removal along all sides of the University Club (Sherman, Good Hope, and N. 51st Street).

STREETS & TRAFFIC: The Director is working on processing/approving utility right-of-way permits from WE-Energies, AT&T, Spectrum, and various fiber optic/communication companies. Utility permits are processed and approved for work occurring within Village R/W. Plans are reviewed for placement and conflicts with Village owned facilities.

The Director is working on the 2022 planning and cost estimates for the roadway re-paving program streets list along with estimating the public improvements in the Original Village as part of the F-Street development project at the old DPW site. Public improvements include, but are not limited to, sidewalk addition on N. 43rd Street and angle on-street parking addition along Deerwood Drive south of Larry's to Peabody's/Wade Weissman.

REFUSE AND RECYCLING: The DPW crew is out picking trash in the medians and public right-of-way areas. Special attention is given to the high traffic areas along W. Brown Deer Road, N. Green Bay Road, N. Teutonia Avenue, N. Sherman Blvd, W. Bradley Road, N. 51st Street, and N. 60th Street.

The DPW crew services the Recycling Center each morning. The crew condenses all the bins and removes the brush from the brush pile area. GFL changes out/empties all the 20-yd containers each day.

PARKS & RECREATION: The DPW crew is working in repairing and rebuilding picnic tables.
